

# Home Page Layout Planning

**Objective:** Using MS Word create a wireframe layout planning document complete with div names for each of your sections.

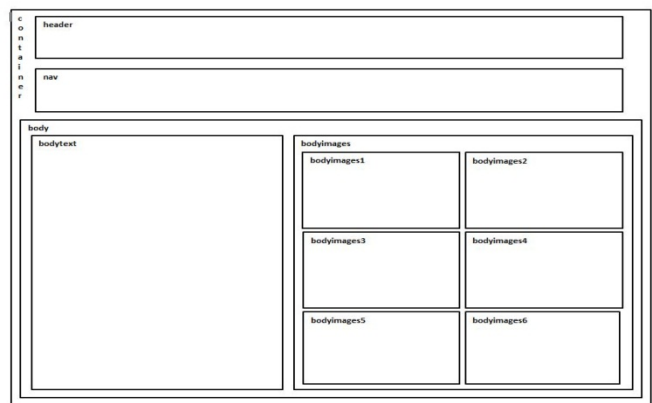
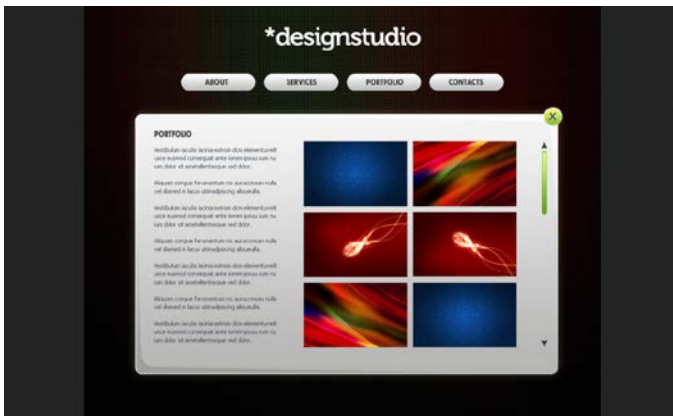
**Brainstorming:** Decide some of the things you want to include on your home page. At a minimum you should have container, header, nav, and body. You can have more depending on your design.

**Resources:** Use a search engine to look at other layouts to help generate ideas.

**Create:** Once you have an idea about what you think you want your page to look like open up MS Word and create a planning “sketch” that includes all the necessary div sections to make it happen. Draw your div sections with text boxes. Most monitors are larger horizontal than they are vertical so it would be a good idea to switch the layout to landscape. Remember to use an appropriate naming scheme. Example main body 1 = BAD mainbody1 = GOOD. Don’t use spaces and stick with lower case. When you are finished do a print preview. If everything looks good print a copy to turn in. Make sure to write your name on the back.

**Scoring:**

All the required div sections are included: (container, header, nav, body)	<b>10</b>
Neatness: Precise measurements are not necessary, but visually it should look professional.	<b>5</b>
Div naming: All your div sections follow and appropriate naming scheme.	<b>5</b>
